I have sent by Express to your address a parcel containing some numbers of the Archives du Museum d'histoire naturelle presented to Yale College through M. Vattemare in the name of the Professors & Curators of the Museum of Natural History.

In M. Vattemare's letter to me, he says that in 1855, he placed in the hands of Mr Gilman, Vols. 4, 5 & 6 of the Recueil de la Commission française at the Universal Exposition of 1855, the only volumes then published, that since that time he has received the continuation of that work, but ignorant whether Mr Gilman presented the former volumes to the State Library or to the Library of Yale College he waits for information before transmitting the remainder.





My dear Sir:

I send you by Express this morning a parcel containing Acts of Congress from the 2^d session of the 6th Congress, 1800-01, to the 3^d session of the 37th Congress 1862-3, inclusive, except

$\frac{1}{8}$, $\frac{2}{8}$, $\frac{1}{9}$, $\frac{2}{19}$, $\frac{2}{11}$, $\frac{1}{12}$, $\frac{2}{12}$, $\frac{1}{18}$, $\frac{2}{18}$, $\frac{1}{19}$, $\frac{2}{19}$, $\frac{1}{20}$, $\frac{1}{21}$, $\frac{1}{29}$. — not found

They are complete from $\frac{2}{22}$ (1832-3), to the present time wanting only $\frac{1}{29}$, (1845-6). You will notice that the list varies somewhat from that in mine of July 29. — on examination I found that some were wanting to complete our own set, but I discovered some others which I did not then suppose we could send you, and the number of deficient acts is about the same in both lists.

The set in this library wants all before the 3^d session of the 5th Congress (1798-9) and $\frac{1}{6}$, $\frac{1}{9}$, $\frac{2}{11}$, $(\frac{1}{29})$, $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{2}{5}$.

The Connecticut Historical Society also desires to complete a set. and I want a few numbers for another purpose —

The inclosed memorandum shews all that are wanting, including those needed by the State and by Yale College — You could take it with you into the State House, and as you find any, draw a pencil

mark through the figure. You will find some
books in the cupboard on your right as you enter, and
a partial set I think on the side by the windows.

After you have found as many of those on the memorandum as you can, reserve first such as the State wants, second such as Yale College wants, and the rest (with those you reserve for the State) please send me by express, — Of course I don't want all the Acts which are in the State House, but only such as are indicated on the memorandum —

You will also please inform me what deficiencies
in your series you may supply - I may be able
to find others in some corner here or in the Historical
Society and will do what I can for you.
