RESOLVED, that a Committee of three be appointed by the President to prepare and submit to the Board of Trustees for approval, their recommendations as to the adoption of suitable gowns and hoods to be used at Commencements and upon other public occasions, to indicate the University status and the degrees held by the wearers of the same, and be it further,

RESOLVED, that the said Committee be authorized to confer with similar Committees, when such are appointed, by the governing bodies of Harvard, Yale, Columbia, Johns Hopkins and other Universities and Colleges, looking to the adoption, so far as possible, by the several Universities and Colleges of similar gowns or hoods to indicate the degrees held by the wearers, and at the same time indicating the University or College by which the degree had been granted.
